Passion Flower, Purple <i>Passiflora incarnata</i>	P	10-25'	1-5'	Spring, Summer, Fall	Y	Large three lobed leaves with showy, purple pinwheel flowers	1,4,5	Prune to direct and control growth, cut back unwanted suckers
Passion Flower, Yellow <i>Passiflora lutea</i>	P	10-15'	1-2'	Summer		Small greenish-yellow blooms followed by purple or black berries	5	Give lots of room or trim and pull suckers to control in smaller spaces
Poison Ivy <i>Toxicodendron radicans</i>	D		0.5-50'	Fall		Red leaves		Pull or spray all leaves with glyphosate to remove
Snapdragon Vine <i>Maurandya antirrhiniflora</i>	P	3-5'	1-3'	Spring, Summer, Fall		Purple flowers resemble miniature snapdragon blossoms	1,4,5,6	
Texas Wisteria <i>Wisteria frutescens</i>	P	Vine, climbing to 25-30'		May - June		Flowers white, pink, blue, purple, violet. Usually lavender blue.	4,5	Train on sturdy arbor, wall, column, etc. Prune to shape during winter dormancy
Trumpet Vine <i>Campsis radicans</i>	P	To 35'		June - Sept	Y	Red, orange, yellow flowers in 3 - 4 in panicles.	4,5	Keep off buildings, roofs, etc. to prevent damage. Prune and/or mow to control suckers
Virginia Creeper <i>Parthenocissus quinquefolia</i>	D		3-40'	Fall	Y	Red or purple leaves	2,4,5	Prune to direct and control growth
White Honeysuckle Bush <i>Lonicera alba</i>	SE	4-10'	10-12'	Spring	Y	White flowers	1,4,5,6	Prune for shape

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Woolly Dutchman's Pipe (Common Dutchman's Pipe) <i>Aristolochia tomentosa</i>	P	20-30'	5' - 10'	Spring		Unusual flowers resemble Dutch pipe.	1	Train on porches, posts, trellises, fences, etc.
