General Information

The Pineapple Express is a Hybrid of an Agave for structure and a Manfreda for color. It is a tender perennial, slow growing and useful in container arrangements.

Hardiness Zones: 9-10 Heat Tolerance: Not cold hardy, mid-20 F Height Size: 12" tall x 18" wide Flowers: Tall thin stalk with small greenish cluster of flowers Bloom Time: Summer Leaves: Evergreen, green with burgundy spots Growth Habit/Shape: Slow growth, symmetrical rosette resembling a pineapple Dormancy: Winter Soil Requirements: Well draining **Propagation:** Small plants with a small root at the base called Off-Sets or Pups and can be repotted. **Indoor/Outdoor:** Indoor or outside to mid-20 F

Mealy bugs and scale

Plant Care

Winter dormancy, requiring less water in the winter. Minimum of 6 hours of bright light. Use container with drainage hole to prevent root rot and water using Drench, Drain and Dry technique. Soil is 50% coarse sand and 50% succulent mix. Fertilize in the spring.
