Full Sun Water: Low-medium, drought tolerant 2-3' Tall x 1-2' Wide Color: Gray-Green Bushy, woody subshrub with finely divided foliage Prune to limit spread

General Information

Artemisia 'Powis Castle' has soft-textured, aromatic, gray-green foliage that contrasts nicely with red, pink, or purple flowers. A woody based perennial.

Characteristics

Hardiness Zones: 7-9 Heat Tolerance: High

Size: 2-3 ft tall by 1-2 ft wide **Flowers:** Rare, insignificant

Leaves: Silver, fine-textured, aromatic when crushed

Growth Habit/Shape: Shrubby mounds
Dormancy: Winter depending on cold severity
Soil Requirements: Free draining; in raised beds or

containers if have clay soil

Propagation: Divide by removing spreading rhizomes

Indoor/Outdoor: Outdoor

Plant Care

Artemisia 'Powis Castle' grows quickly, preferring full sun and well-drained soil. The plant is heat tolerant with low supplemental watering needs, once established. Fertilize at planting time with a timed-release product. Cut back the dead foliage to six inches after it freezes in late fall or early winter. Best planted in fall to allow the plant to establish before sustained heat.

Notes

Moderately Deer Resistant. Susceptible to root rot in wet soils.
